When sleeve measures approx. $42-43-44-46-48-$ $49 \mathrm{~cm} / 16.5-16.9-17.3-18.1-19.3$ in, work in patt A (B) as charted. Bind off 14-14-14-16-16-16 sts mid under sleeve where arrow points out (and there is $97-99-101-$ $105-111-115$ sts on a rnd), $(7-7-7-8-8-8$ sts both sides of the marker). Leave work aside, and knit the other sleeve same.
Yoke: Knit all sts on same circular needle size $31 / 2 \mathrm{~mm}$. Slip sleeve sts over the bound-off armhole sts $=363-383$ $-403-419-447-471$ sts on a rnd. Place markers at each 4 seamline. Beg raglan-dec: Work until 2 sts rem before a marker, sl 1 st, 1,psso, K2tog. Rep dec at each 4 seamline every $2^{\text {nd }}$ rnd. When patt $A(B)$ is ready, cont working in St st with clr II (white). Rep dec until $99-103$ $-107-115-119-127$ sts rem. Leave sts on needle, until front bands are ready.
Finishing : Dampen the work slightly from WS. Sew 2 dense zigzag seams mid front. Cut open between seams.
Sew normal zigzag over cut edges.
Left front band: Using needles size 3 mm and clr I (red), pick or knit up approx. $145-149-151-153-155-159$ sts along left edge. Work 3 rows in St st. Bind off. Take care that edge doesn't turn out too tight. Turn work inside out, and using needles size 3 mm and clr (red), pick or knit up approx. 145-149-151-153-155-159 sts from WS. Work 3 rows in St st. Inc evenly on $1^{\text {st }}$ row 48 sts evenly across $S t$ sts. Place a marker mid back. When hood measures approx. 2 $\mathrm{cm} / 0.8$ in, inc 1 st both sides of the marker. Rep inc approx. every $3 \mathrm{~cm} / 1.2$ in altog. 6-6-6-7-7-7 times. When hood measures approx. 27-27-28-28-29-29 $\mathrm{cm} / 10.6-10.6-11-11-11.4-11.4 \mathrm{in}$, dec 1 st both sides of the marker. Rep dec every $4^{\text {th }}$ row 2 times, and then every $2^{\text {nd }}$ row until hood measures approx. 34-35-$36-36-37-38 \mathrm{~cm} / 13.4-13.8-14.2-14.2-14.6-15$ in. Bind off. Join top seam of the hood.
Finishing: Sew zipper between front bands.
Sew underarm seams. Weave in all ends on WS.

Leave work aside, and knit same for the other sleeve.

Finland: 6 rnds with white, 4 rnds with blue, 6 rnds with white (all sizes). Change to navy blue/black yarn, and needles size $31 / 2 \mathrm{~mm}$. Knit 1 rnd, and inc evenly across number of sts to be 59-63-65-69-69 sts. Place a marker beg of rnd = mid under sleeve. Cont working in St st. Inc 1 st both sides of the marker approx. every $21 / 2-2-2-2-1 \frac{1}{2} \mathrm{~cm} / 1-0.8-0.8-0.8-$ 0.6 in . When work measures approx. $5 \mathrm{~cm} / 2$ in less than the given length, or as desired (measured from folding edge), work in patt A as charted. Check from mid st where to beg patt. Bind off on last rnd 10-12-$12-12$ sts mid under sleeve ( $=5-6-6-6$ sts both sides of the marker). Leave work aside, and knit same for the other sleeve.
Yoke: Slip all pieces on same circular needle, sleeves above bound-off sts for armholes $=242-276-302-338$ sts. Cont working in patt A as charted. Dec evenly across 1 sr rnd number of sts to be 240-276-300-336 sts. Cont working in patt, and dec for yoke as foll:
$4 / 6 \mathbf{~ y r s ~ ( ~} \mathbf{3 ~ d e c}$ )- Purl until $2^{\text {nd }}$ rnd. Dec evenly across number of sts to be 204 sts. Dec evenly across next purlstripe number of sts to be 162 sts . Dec evenly across next purl-stripe to be 120 sts. End with a complete or half patt report.
$8 / 10-12$ and 14 yrs ( $\mathbf{4} \mathrm{dec}$ ) - Purl until $2^{\text {nd }}$ rnd. Dec evenly across number of sts to be 240-264-288 sts. Dec evenly across next purl-stripe number of sts to be 204-222240 sts. Dec evenly across next purl-stripe number of sts to be 164-180-192 sts. Dec evenly across last purl-stripe number of sts to be 124-138-144 sts. End with a complete or half patt report.
Neck (same for all sizes): Dec evenly across number of sts to be 80-88-94-98 sts. Change to needles size 3 mm , and the cast-on clr for sleeves. Work in stripes of the chosen flag, same as for sleeves. Knit 1 rnd, purl 1 rnd (= folding edge). Work 11 rnds with red ( Norway and Denmark), white (Finland) or blue (Sweden) yarn. Bind off rather loosely.

## Finishing

Sew underarm seams. Fold lower edge of the body, sleeves and neck in double and sew on WS. Weave in all ends on WS.
Dampen garment slightly with a cloth.

Using needles size 7 mm and red yarn, cast on 50 sts. Work back and forth 3 rows in K2,P2 rib. Cont working in Garter st, and inc evenly across $1^{\text {st }}$ row number of sts to be 56 sts. After first 2 red rows, work 2 rows with white, 4 rows with blue, and 1 row with white yarn. Change to red yarn again. Work 2 rows in Garter st over all sts. K52, turn, K48. Turn, and knit 4 sts less each time until 4 sts rem on a row. Work 2 rows in Garter st over all sts. Bind off.

## FINISHING

Before felting: Sew on head, hat, belt, strap and shoes. Tie fringes for hair, and sew on eyes, ears and nose. Make a pom-pom and fasten it on left side of the hat.
FELTING: Hobbygarn felts easily. Use $30-40^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ fine wash program, max. 40 min . Test first with a swatch. Shape while still damp.

Work in patt A as charted. Slip 19-21-23-25-27 sts on holder. Work back and forth in patt B over rem 21-23-25-27-29 sts. Cont with navy blue yarn. Purl 1 row over all sts with navy blue yarn K14-16-17-1920, turn. Slip first st, P 7-9-9-11-11, turn. Slip first st, and work each time 1 more st until 2 sts rem on each side. Turn, knit all sts, ending on the left side of the heel. Change to red yarn, and knit up approx.10-12-13-15-16 sts along left side of the heel, K19-21-23-25-27 sts from holder, and knit up approx.10-12-13-15-16 sts along right side of the heel. Cont working in rnds in St st, and dec same time 1 st both sides of the heel every rnd until 40-44-48-52-56 sts rem on a rnd. Cont working until sock measures approx.16-18-20-22-24 cm/6.3-7.1-7.9-8.79.4 in (or as desired before dec).

Beg dec: Place markers each side. Dec 1 st both sides of the markers every $2^{\text {nd }}$ rnd 2 times, and then every rnd until 12 sts rem. Thread yarn through rem sts, and weave in on WS.

Slip 20-22-24-26-28 sts on holder.
Cont working with navy blue yarn, and knit heel over rem 20-22-24-26-28 sts. Work back and forth 5-6-6-7-8 cm/2-2.4-2.4-2.8-3.1 in in St st. Dec for heel: K14-16-17-19-20, turn. Slip first st, P6-8-8-10-10, turn. Slip first st, and work 1 st more each time, until 2 sts rem at each edge. Turn, and knit 1 row, ending on left side of the heel. Pick or knit up approx. 10-12-13-15-16 sts both sides of the heel (worked with navy blue until they have been decreased). After 2 rnds working patt B on top of the foot, and in patt A for sole (Note! Twist yarns approx. every 3 sts, and same time dec1 st both sides of the heel every rnd until $40-44-48-52-56$ sts rem on a rnd. When patt B is ready, work with navy blue yarn over all sts. When work measures approx.16-18-20-22-24 cm/6.3-7.1-7.9-8.79.4 in (or desired length before dec), beg dec: Place markers each side. Cont working with navy blue yarn, and dec 1 st both sides of the markers every $2^{\text {nd }}$ rnd 2 times, and after that every rnd until 12 sts rem. Thread yarn through rem sts, and weave in on WS.

Change to needles size $41 / 2 \mathrm{~mm}$ and white yarn. Work in patt A as charted. Slip 13-15-17-19-21-23 sts on holder. Work back and forth for heel in patt B over rem $15-17-19-21-23-25$ sts. Purl 1 row over all sts. Dec as foll: K11-12-13-15-17-18, turn. Slip first st, P7-7-7-9-11-11, turn. Slip first st, and work 1 st more each time until 2 sts rem at each edge. Turn, and knit 1 row, ending at the left side of the heel. Knit up 9-10-$11-13-15-16$ sts along left side of the heel, work in patt C over 13-15-17-19-21-23 sts on holder, and knit up $9-10-11-13-15-16$ sts from right side of the heel.
Cont working in patt D for sole and both sides of the heel, and patt $C$ over top of the foot, and dec same time 1 st both sides of patt C every rnd until $28-32-36-40-44$ -48 sts rem on a rnd. When patt C is ready, work in patt A , and after that cont in St st with white yarn until foot measures approx. $12-15-19-23-27-30 \mathrm{~cm} / 4.7-5.9-$ $7.5-9.1-10.6-11.8$ in (or $2-2-3-3-3-4-4 \mathrm{~cm} /$ in less than desired length). Place markers around $1^{\text {st }}$ and last st of patt D. Change to navy blue yarn. Work 1 rnd in St st, and beg after that dec as foll: Work until 2 sts rem before a marker, sl 1 st,K1,psso, K2tog. Rep dec at each side every $2^{\text {nd }}$ rnd $1-1-1-2-2-2$ times, and then every rnd until 8 sts rem. Thread yarn through rem sts, and weave in on WS.
